Traveling European Shoulder Fellowship



William N. Levine, MD was selected as one of the 2 American Shoulder and Elbow Surgeons' (ASES) traveling fellows this year. Eight shoulder and elbow centers in 7 countries were visited including Bern and Zurich, Switzerland; Heidelberg, Germany; Reading, England; Lyon, France; Modena, Italy; Aarhus, Denmark; and Salzburg, Austria.

Highlights included first-hand experience with the pearls and pitfalls of the reverse-ball prosthesis as well as state-of-the-art advances in rehabilitation and tendon transfers. Dr. Levine currently serves as the Director of Sports Medicine and the Associate Director of the Center for Shoulder, Elbow and Sports Medicine.
